

Weekly Discussion Guide – 7-26-2026

Vision Check, Part 1: “Eyes to See the Unseen”

Text: 2 Kings 6:8-23

1. How have you heard the word “vision” used? Are there certain areas in your life where you feel pressure to constantly manufacture a ____-year plan or blueprint for the future?
2. How can too much focus on the future rob us of our ability to experience God in the here and now? How have you experienced this personally?
3. Look up **Proverbs 29:18** in multiple English translations (biblegateway.com is a great resource). What do you notice? What does this verse seem to be saying about what it means to live with “vision,” “revelation,” or “guidance” from God?
4. Read **2 Kings 6:8-23**. Can you identify a current circumstance in your life (e.g., finances, family, health) where your physical eyes only see the “enemy army” closing in? What does your internal panic look like in that situation?
5. Read **2 Corinthians 5:7**. Based on Elisha’s story, how would you define the difference between living by physical sight and living by spiritual faith?
6. While God occasionally gives a “Nehemiah vision” to rebuild a wall or a “Solomon vision” to build a Temple, most of our living requires “Elisha vision” to see the unseen of heaven. Think about your upcoming week/month. Where are you waiting for a “blueprint” from God? Where do you need the faith to look for His subtle, active presence in your current circumstances or routine?
7. This week, we are challenged to take a daily **Vision Check** by pausing before checking calendars, bank accounts, news headlines, etc., and pray: “*Lord, open my eyes today that I may see.*” What is one specific situation you anticipate facing this week where you especially need to pause and pray this sentence?
