Vision Check, Part 2: “Eyes to See the One and the one”

Text: John 9

1. Share about a time when you were completely convinced you were right about something, only to discover later that you were mistaken. What do these kinds of experiences teach us?
2. Read **John 9:1–41** aloud. Notice how different people “see” the blind man and how their understanding changes or doesn't change throughout the story. What stands out to you? Why?
3. How can religious certainty sometimes be a more dangerous form of blindness than outright fear (like in last week's story from 2 Kings 6)?
4. When are you most tempted to see people as problems, projects, labels, or inconveniences instead of humans created in the image of God? What does Jesus' response teach us about God's perspective?
5. Why do you think personal testimony is often more powerful than winning an argument? If someone asked what Jesus has done in your life, what would some of your “one thing I do know...” statements be?
6. “When we lose sight of the One, we lose sight of the one.” Where do you see that happening around you in our culture, in churches, in your own life?
7. Have you ever experienced a season when following Jesus cost you something—a relationship, reputation, comfort, or opportunity? How did Christ meet you in that season?
8. Who is a “one” God may be inviting you to truly see this week? Is there someone you can forgive, encourage, notice, listen to, or serve?

This week, begin each day with this simple prayer: **“Lord, open my eyes that I may see. Help me see the One, Jesus. And because I see the One, help me see the one in front of me more like He does.”**
