

Weekly Discussion Guide – 9-6-2026

Ordinary Missionaries, Part 5: “When We Go Together”

Texts: Luke 10:1-2, 2 Timothy 1:5, 2:2

1. Have you ever been part of a team, group, or community where you accomplished or experienced something you probably would not have on your own? What made being together so significant?
2. Read Luke 10:1–4. What stands out to you about the way Jesus sends the seventy-two? Why do you think Jesus chose to send them two by two rather than individually?
3. Jesus tells them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few.” Where do you see a “plentiful harvest” around you right now? Who are the people or places where God may already be working that we sometimes overlook?
4. The message described three rhythms we develop when we live on mission together: seeing, hearing, and moving. Which of these rhythms do you think comes most naturally to you? Which one do you need other believers to help you develop?
5. How can being on mission with other followers of Jesus help us see things we might otherwise miss, hear God more clearly, or move toward opportunities we might be hesitant to pursue alone?
6. Read 2 Timothy 1:5. Paul points to the faith of Timothy’s grandmother Lois and mother Eunice as part of Timothy’s story. Who modeled faithfulness to Jesus for you? What did you see in their life that shaped your own faith?
7. Read 2 Timothy 2:2. Paul challenges Timothy not simply to receive what he has learned, but to entrust it to others who will teach others. What does this tell us about our responsibility to the people beside us and the generations coming behind us?
8. Consider the two questions from the end of the message: 1) Who are you doing life with? 2) How are you investing in those beside and behind you? What is one intentional step you could take this week to live as an ordinary missionary with someone else rather than trying to do it alone?
